

So, begins God's conversation with Adam and Eve after their fall. God has come seeking them, for they are in hiding. cool of the evening, that this is a continued conversation. It seems that this has been His pattern. He has chosen to speak with His man and His woman face-to-face. What a privilege.

Throughout the Bible it becomes obvious that this is in His nature. He speaks not only to Adam and Eve, but to Enoch, to Noah, to Abraham, to Moses, to Joshua, to the Judges, to the Kings, to Jesus, His Disciples and to us as His children.

He speaks to us because He desires for us to speak to Him. This is prayer. He does not give us a formula. He does not give to us a vocabulary. He does give to us an invitation.

invitation. God desires that you come to Him

daily even as you are.

He will listen to you out of His great love for you. He will welcome your questions. He will consider your requests. He will answer you. He will abide with you. The best way to pray is naturally, expectantly, gratefully. You have a Father in Heaven who will always be there for you.

The most exciting truth about spending time with our Heavenly Father in prayer is that He is anxious for us to do so. It's not like we have to get an appointment for Him to have time to sit down and meet with us. He's there always. Morning. Afternoon. Night. It doesn't matter to Him. And he understands our language. We don't have to perfect it for him. We need not adapt our language for His

"Come to me all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." Matthew 11:28 benefit. Children typically speak to their father simply and honestly. This is what our Heavenly Father offers and expects from us. He is here for us. He is bending near, eager to hear what we have to say. In fact, His Holy Spirit enables our the

thoughts and feelings deep in our hearts which are difficult for us to even know how to speak.

Perhaps the key word is to relax and realize the reality and the majesty of God's Love for us so that we come to Him both gladly and expectantly, not reluctantly and grudgingly. We come to Him as beloved children and not as unwilling servants. He truly desires the truth that is in our hearts. His hope is for us to openly share our truest and deepest feeling with Him, along with our toughest questions. He is never offended by our questions. He will give us true and honest answers as He speaks into our lives loving direction and instruction and correction so that we might find His best for each of us. Just like the very best of our earthly fathers, our Heavenly Father welcomes those times when we are figuratively in His lap speaking to our Abba and being totally open and responsive to Him.

Actually it is our eager and open attitude rather than our proper sounding platitudes He

desires. When we come to Him we will find Him waiting, expecting, loving.

Not only Psalms, but other Bible books as well, offer us models of inspiring and challenging prayers that can guide us as we continue to grow in our prayer lives.

I have a daily journal in which I have a tab for each day of the week. It is just a guide that gives me a starting point.

DAILY: Praise and Worship; Confession and Cleansing; Petition for Personal Holiness and Ministry; Meditation on Scripture—Journal

thoughts; Intercession for Family Member's Spiritual and Physical Needs

SUNDAY: My Church Leaders, Pastor, Key Leaders, etc.; My God-given Ministry, My Church "... but the Spirit himself intercedes for us as with groaning too deep for words." Romans 8:26

MONDAY: Those Who Do Not Know Christ and Backslidden Believers; Spiritual Needs for Workmates, Classmates, Those We See In Daily Life (Waiters, Doctors, Clerks, Neighbors, etc.)

TUESDAY: Revival and Growth in the Church; Spiritual Awakening in Your Community; Missionaries and PersecutedBelievers

WEDNESDAY: Key Denominational Leaders (Local, State, SBC, IMB, NAMB; Spiritual Leaders of Other Churches (local Pastors, etc.)

THURSDAY: Those in Authority; National, State, Local (President, Governor, Mayors, Senators, Representatives, City Councils, etc.)

FRIDAY: Key Evangelism Initiatives (Local, State, National, Global); Key Mission Initiatives (Local, State, National, Global)

SATURDAY: Special Heart Burdens, Enemies and Persecutors
